*Parents of students are encouraged to do their own research regarding facial coverings to make the best personal decision for their child (see CDC and ADPH websites for guidance). There are exceptions to facial coverings for students with disabilities. Under this protocol, if a specific school reaches 10% of student population self-reporting positive, masks will be required of all students and staff for a minimum of two weeks. If a specific school reaches 13% of student population self-reporting positive, the school will move to A/B rotating schedule. Parents will be given as much notice as possible before transitioning to A/B. Currently the district plans for any specific school site that goes to an A/B rotating schedule, to remain on this schedule for a minimum of two weeks. Parents are encouraged to plan ahead for this possibility.

Oxford City Schools is NOT a part of contact tracing of COVID-19. School districts have been notified that this is the sole responsibility of the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) to notify individuals of possible exposure. Additionally, this plan is based on the information we have at this point (September 1, 2021). If any new information is received or released from ADPH or any governmental authority, this may cause this plan to change. Please check social media outlets and our website regularly.
